CELEBRATING 70 YEARS IN THE SANCTUARY & A RICH FAITH HISTORY

The earliest recorded gatherings of Newton Methodists date back to the 1840s when circuit riders would come through and hold services. Our first church building was a one-room wood frame building that was destroyed by a tornado in 1884. A Bible from that church that survived the storm remains on display in the Narthex today. The church was rebuilt diagonally across from Beth Eden Lutheran Church (where the Bank of Granite is located) and continued to grow and served as a Newton Landmark along an avenue of churches. In May of 1947, fire destroyed the main auditorium of our second church building and once again church leaders set out to rebuild. The result of their efforts is the Sanctuary we celebrate 70 years later.



The Methodist Women's group was reminded of this anniversary during a recent history presentation and began planning for a special 70th Anniversary Celebration Service that will take place on October 7 at 10:30 a.m. The group feels that it is important to retell the stories of our church so that the next generation will understand our rich history. "This church holds very special memories for me," said Pat Simmons. "Our family was always at church. It's always been a good place to be. We've had a lot of good preachers and just a lot of good people. I'm excited to see what the future holds for our church."

"I remember watching the construction of our 'new' church," said long-time member Frances Hollar. "I joined and was baptized here when I was twelve. I have so many cherished memories of Sunday school teachers, youth leaders, pastors and other mentors who were my much loved church family."

The entire congregation is invited to a complimentary lunch served by the Methodist Women immediately following the service on October 7.
