TOWN HALL MEETING CELEBRATES 2018 AND LOOKS AHEAD

First Newton's 2nd annual Town Hall Meeting was held Sunday, January 27 in the Fellowship Hall. The evening included dinner, fellowship, a First Newton trivia contest and updates on the ministry, finances, and vision steps for First Newton. Church Council Chairperson Jim Richard introduced our new council members and also provided an update on our Preserve, Protect, Modernize renovation project. The Renovation Team has chosen to work with Wesley Development Corporation and an architect is currently developing preliminary drawings to present to the Church Council. Once those plans are received congregation wide listening sessions will be held to solicit input and answer questions regarding the renovation plan. George Wilkinson, Finance Chair, provided the group with a very positive financial update (details on page 2).

Rev. Willis provided an update on the action steps outlined in 2018 by the Vision Team. We celebrated the completion of four of our eight action items:

- Under the leadership of Debbie Rights, we developed a schedule for the Sunday Morning Experience that fosters interaction among all worshippers and maximizes resources. The new Sunday schedule began on June 10, 2018.
- Under the leadership of Lisa Johnson, Polly Pearson, and Brandy Burnette, we have formed a Hospitality Team to implement and coordinate intentional acts of welcome. Special thanks to the 100 people who accepted the Hospitality Challenge.
- Quarterly, we are offering a "Pastries with the Pastors" or "Pizza with the Pastors" event to provide periodic gatherings for prospective members to learn more about the church.
- Under the leadership of Melissa Ervin we have enhanced our nursery ministry.

2018 YEAR-END REPORT FROM THE FINANCE TEAM

During the January 27 Town Hall Meeting, George Wilkinson provided a financial report on the church's current state. The detailed hand-out is available in the Welcome Center. Highlights from the report include:

- We received \$52,048 income in the month of December 2018, with just 3 weeks of giving!
- We budgeted \$381,000 income for 2018 but received \$426,536.
- We were able to pay 100% of our Conference's apportionment of \$44,766.
- 88 Families have pledged \$327,530 for 2019. This is an increase of approximately \$42,000. We received 17 new pledges in 2019 totaling \$42,464.
- The Christmas Eve offering for ECCCM and Corner Table was \$700.
